**Interesting character:** Pick the character you think is the most interesting. What attributes does this character possess that makes that character especially interesting? Include at least two or three traits and give examples from the book where the character demonstrates the quality.

**Conflict:** Describe the major conflicts and the type of conflict (ex: man vs man, man vs nature). Were you satisfied with the resolution and why?

**Memorable Lines:** Choose **two** quotes from the book that are especially memorable and explain the significance of the quote. Remember, quotes do not have to be dialogue. Any lines taken out of a book are considered quotes from the text. Be sure to cite the quotes properly. Example: In the novel, *Call of the Wild*, the author describes Buck's connection to the wilderness as a "deep in the forest a call was sounding, and as often as he heard this call, he felt compelled to turn his back upon the fire..." (London 112).
